Why should we become generous and joyful givers?

Wrong answers:

- “God needs my money” (Isaiah 66:1-2).
- “God will make me rich.”
- “My money buys God’s favor (Ephesians 2:8-9).”

Why should we become generous and joyful givers?

Reason 1: Giving is an act of worship to our worthy God (Exodus 35-36).

What is worship?

To acknowledge the value or superiority of God with our words, songs, acts of devotion, or gifts.

Giving is an act of worship, in which we proclaim that God is worth everything we have to give.
