1 Samuel 17.2-4

Saul and the Israelite army assembled and camped in the valley of Elah, where they arranged their battle lines to fight against the **Philistines**. The Philistines were standing on one hill, and the Israelites on another hill, with the valley between them.



1 Samuel 17.2-4

Then a champion came out from the camp of the Philistines. His name was **Goliath**; he was from Gath. He was close to seven feet tall.



1 Samuel 17.10-11

Then the Philistine said, “I defy Israel’s troops this day! Give me a man so we can fight each other!” When Saul and all the Israelites heard these words of the Philistine, they were **upset** and very **afraid**.



1 Samuel 17.13

Jesse's three oldest sons had followed Saul to war. The names of the three sons who went to war were **Eliab**, his firstborn, Abinadab, the second oldest, and Shammah, the third oldest.





1 Samuel 17.22-23

After David had entrusted his cargo to the care of the supply officer, he ran to the battlefield. When he arrived, he asked his brothers how they were.



1 Samuel 17.22-23

As he was speaking with them, the champion named Goliath, the Philistine from Gath, was coming up from the battle lines of the Philistines. He spoke as he usually did, and **David heard it.**





1 Samuel 17.26

David asked the men... “Who is this Philistine, that he defies the armies of the living God?”

1 Samuel 17.40

He took his **staff** in his hand, picked out five smooth **stones** from the stream, placed them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag, took his **sling** in hand, and approached the Philistine.



1 Samuel 17.34-37

David said to Saul, “Your servant has been a shepherd for his father’s flock. Whenever a **lion** or **bear** would come and carry off a sheep from the flock, I would go out after it, strike it down, and **rescue the sheep** from its mouth.”



1 Samuel 17.34-37

If it rose up against me, I would **grab it** by its jaw, **strike it**, and **kill it**. Your servant has struck down both the lion and the bear. This Philistine will be just like one of them. For he has defied the armies of the living God!”



1 Samuel 17.34-37

David went on to say, “The Lord who delivered me from the **lion** and the **bear** will also deliver me from the hand of this **Philistine!**” Then Saul said to David, “Go! The Lord will be with you.”



John 16.20-22

I tell you the solemn truth, you will **weep** and wail, but the world will rejoice; you will be **sad**, but your **sadness will turn into joy**.



John 16.20-22

When a woman gives birth, she has distress because her time has come, but when her child is born, she no longer remembers the suffering because of her joy that a human being has been born into the world.

So also **you have sorrow now**, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and **no one will take your joy** away from you.





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
