# DO NOT JUDGE

“Do not judge so that you will not be judged. For the in the way that you judge, you will be judged; and by your standard of measure, it will be measured to you.

# DO NOT JUDGE

“Why do you look at the speck that is in your brother’s eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ and behold, the log is in your own eye?”

# DO NOT JUDGE

“You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother’s eye.”

# DO NOT JUDGE

For what have I to do with judging outsiders? Do you not judge those who are within the church? But those who are outside, God judges. Remove the wicked man from among you.”

1 Corinthians 5:12-13

# DO NOT JUDGE

If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother.

Matthew 18:15

# DO NOT JUDGE

My brethren, if any among you strays from the truth and one turns him back, let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death.

James 5:19-20a

# DO NOT JUDGE

Do not judge according to appearance,  
but judge with righteous judgment.

John 7:24

# DO NOT JUDGE

Why is the usual interpretation wrong?

- The Bible encourages us to make moral judgments.
- The passage says more than, “Do not judge.”
- Everybody makes moral judgments.

DO NOT JUDGE

What does the passage mean?

When you make judgments, do so carefully and charitably.

# DO NOT JUDGE

Therefore you have no excuse, everyone of you who passes judgment, for in that which you judge another, you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things.

Romans 2:1

# DO NOT JUDGE

## How should we judge?

- Make sure your standard is correct.

# DO NOT JUDGE

Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees,  
hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill  
and cummin, and have neglected the  
weightier provisions of the law: justice  
and mercy and faithfulness;

# DO NOT JUDGE

But these are the things you should have done without neglecting the others. You blind guides, who strain out a gnat and swallow a camel!

Matthew 23:23-24

# DO NOT JUDGE

## How should we judge?

- Make sure your standard is correct.
- Attend to your own sin first.

# DO NOT JUDGE

## Principles to Apply:

- Err on the side of grace.
- Pray before you confront.
- Judge by God's standards.
- Remember that you are a sinner.
- Seek restoration, not condemnation.
