Observe & Interpret

Read 2 Chronicles 6-7 in one setting. Answer the following:

What is the context in this passage? In other words, what was going on in the history of Israel at this time?

What were the specific promises that God made to the people of Israel in 2 Chronicles 7?

Why did Solomon expect God to answer his prayers for both material and spiritual blessings for the nation of Israel (cf. Deut 28-30; 2 Samuel 7:1-16)?

Do these same promises apply to the United States of America? Why or why not?

What timeless truths can we learn about God's character from 2 Chronicles 7:14?

Apply

Spend at least 5 minutes in prayer every day this week. First, confess your sins to the Lord and ask for forgiveness. Second, spend a few minutes praying for our nation and its leaders to know Jesus and to create an environment of peace (1 Timothy 2:1-2).

Memorize: 1 Timothy 2:1-2

First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity.
